## Dear Franconians,

It is 11 p.m. on a Monday evening. As I settle down with a cup of coffee to write the President's Letter for the July edition of the Franconian, the last barrel of beer is about to be buried at the Erich Keller and the final strains of Lilli Marleen, sung by the thousands of visitors present at the *Berg* this evening, will mark the end of the 270<sup>th</sup> Erlangen *Bergkirchweih*.
